Fundraising/Procurement

- We are now working, year-round, with Interfaith Food Ministry. We are an on-going Drop-off location for Food donations.
- Seven Hills Bike program. We had a successful quarter with Seven Hills. We were able to send them a check, for their share of the proceeds, for over \$600. We are pending our next delivery of bicycles.
- **SMER** program. We have Nevada Union Automotive Repair program, previously NU ROP, who has signed up for the Small Engine Repair program (**SMER**). We anticipate that they will be ready to start receiving equipment by March 1, 2020.
- **SMG** program. We are currently working with three groups/schools that are discussing participating in the Small Gift program (**SMG**). Pending update.

Floor Movement

- We are still processing and purging the Tool area from rusted items, debris and outdated merchandise. This is an ongoing project.
 New Signage has been put up in this area.
- We are separating Visions COG items from donated Painting supplies. Donated supplies such as; Rollers, sanding blocks, extension poles, etc. From its current location, next to Visions COG's. This is affecting the Sales in this Department.
